



Lifetime

- jedes Jahr (November) ein Release
- 13.2 bis Anfang 2017
- 13.1 mit Evergreen (bis Anfang 2017)
- 42.1 bis Mai 2017
- 42.2 bis Mai 2018
- Major Releases (36 Monate)



Tumbleweed

- Rolling Release
 - über das Jahr verteilt
- Aktualisierungen
- Test durch openQA
 - für Entwickler geeignet

- Release: 16.11.16




